## PVCC PRAYER PARTNERS

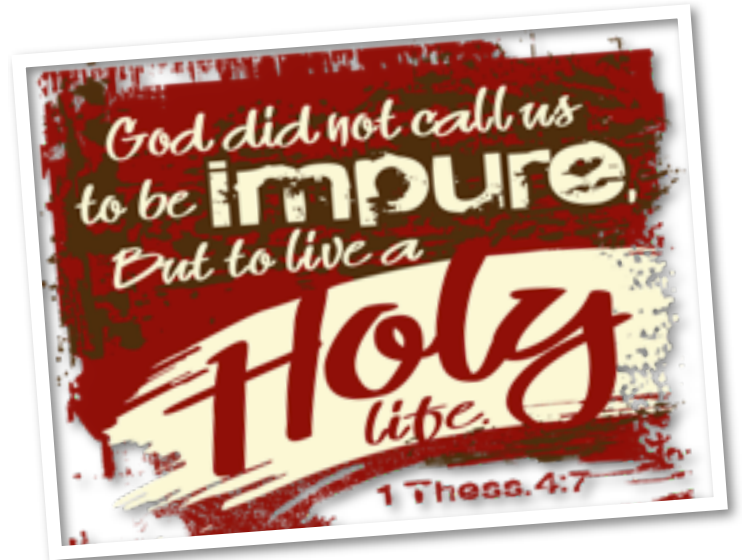

Our Military Ministry has been so blessed, the Lord is awesome in his works and we thank him daily for the Marines, Soldiers and Sailors that he places in front of us to serve. Our ministry is growing. We see his work and his miracles every day. Coincidence and luck are no longer a part of our vocabulary, it is awesome to see God's plan in action.

This past few weeks have been tough for the families of sons and daughters serving in the Armed Forces. You do not hear it, the war in Afghanistan is not reported much on the news. I was not even aware until this morning that we've had 14 Soldier's KIA just in the past four days, that does not include Marines or Sailors. Consider joining us as we ride with the Patriot Guard. You don't have to have a motorcycle, we don't, but it is an honor to stand with them at the funerals of the Fallen. Curt and I attended the fly in of Sgt. Brandon Bury Saturday and attended the funeral Monday. On Wednesday's we have been going out to Riverside Nat'l Cemetary to stand in as family for the Veterans that are being buried there with no family or friends. Every week there is six or seven.

Our son Michael is doing well, please continue to keep him in your prayers, along with Caitlin Bird's husband, Greg. I've include a picture of Greg, one of the last times he held his daughter before deploying. Caitlin will be taking Tess (7 weeks old now!) back to MO in two weeks to stay with family for the remainder of Greg's deployment , she will be driving, please pray for safe travels. ## FATHERS DAY 2010

I recently flew to Hawaii to help my parents celebrate my Mom's 72<sup>nd</sup> birthday. My mom has cancer, and my intention was to spend some quality time with her, to just love on her and enjoy being with her while she is still feeling healthy and strong. God blessed our time together, and we had a wonderful time looking at old photo albums, taking long walks together, going out to eat, and just hanging out and talking. It was awesome.



The funny thing is that, while in my head this whole trip was all about being with my mom, I came home filled with a sense of gratitude and amazement for my father. As my mom and I sat and visited, he would be puttering around, doing his "chores", or fixing something, or sometimes just sitting and reading the paper (aka "napping"), but his presence was always felt. Every once in a while, he would throw in a funny response to something we said, so we knew he was listening, but he wasn't intrusive – just available. I think I saw for the first time how really good he is to my mother, and how much of his routine is based on making her life better. And my mother is quick to sing his praises, and often says, "Your father can



fix anything". She is so proud of him, and it really touched me to see just how suited they are for each other.

Looking at old photos of my dad made me realize my dad was pretty

special. There's the one of him accepting his Eagle Scout award in high school, then as the years progressed, there's pictures of him receiving a variety of community service awards. There are church pictures, pictures of him running in a 10k, pictures of him dancing with my mom at different company and social events, and my favorites: pictures of him with our family.

The more people I talk to, the more I realize how fortunate I've been to have my dad for a father. He was always home to have dinner with us in the evening, ready to share the latest joke heard at the office. He is financially responsible, he doesn't smoke or gamble, and rarely has even one glass of wine. He never beat us children (although we probably deserved it a few times!); he reported to work every day for 30+ years, even during times when I'm sure he didn't want to; he mentored and encouraged minorities and women at work long before it was required by law - he did



it because it was the right thing to do. He's given hundreds of pints of blood over the years, he can fix anything, he's loyal and the only woman he's ever chased has been my mother. Maybe I didn't go looking for Jesus until I was 38 because I didn't need him until then – I'd always had my dad!

So on this Father's Day, I want my dad to know how much I love him, and how grateful I am to have had him for a father. I appreciate you Dad! I hope we have many more years together – on earth and in Heaven. Happy Father's Day!

## YOUTH MISSION TRIP!



**June 27-July 2:** every day we are doing two backyard VBS' for at-risk youth in inner city neighborhoods. Pray for strong relationships to build between the team and the children, for the Word of God to be proclaimed mightily and that we might see many come to the Lord. Pray that we will be able to connect Marvin Robinson, the missionary we are working with, with the families that the Lord might use him to build strong disciples in the inner city or Rochester.

On Tuesday **June 29** we are going to be at Flemming point Retirement Home, preaching the Gospel, sharing testimonies and continuing the work that Marvin does there on a daily basis.

On Wednesday **June 30** we will be at the Rochester Family Mission ministering in music, through testimonies, and through preaching the Gospel. Pray that the Lord will use us in whatever way He wants to there.

**July 3:** we travel by train from ROC to Brooklyn, and participate in some kind of ministry that evening (what it is I am not really sure at this time)

**July 4** is the BIG evangelistic outreach that the Brooklyn Recovery House of Worship (the church we are working with) puts on, and we will be serving there in a variety of capacities. Pray that the Lord will give us willing hearts to be used in any way he sees fit there. Pray that our eyes will be open to the opportunities that the Lord would like us to be a part of.

From **July 5-July 10** we are doing a VBS in one of the Brooklyn projects (same requests as above, only we are now working with Ray Raymos). We are doing that in the morning, and in the evenings we are doing street evangelism. Obviously, people can pray that we would have boldness and we would not fear man, but would obey Jesus through evangelism. Pray that some of the team might see some fruit, as a fruitless ministry is discouraging. But if the Lord does not show us fruit, pray that we would give Him the glory for using us a seed planters instead!
